LGBTOIA+ Risk Factors + Prevalence

Often overlooked, the LGBTQIA+ community frequently experiences higher incidences of domestic and sexual violence. Recent studies reveal that lesbian and gay individuals report a higher prevalence of abuse, including rape, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner compared to heterosexuals. People who are transgender experience disproportionate rates of violence and homicide, particularly transgender people of color. Harambe's team understands the troubling dynamics of abuse experienced by this community, as well as unique barriers to service, the laws protecting marginalized groups, and is well equipped to help provide safe and healing spaces and support.
