What We Do

Training & Education:

NJCASA provides training and technical assistance to its program members and allied professionals, including those who work in the fields of education, policy, law enforcement, healthcare, and the public at large.

Advocacy:

NJCASA advocates for survivor-centered legislation and policies that help create a safer, more equitable society by expanding access to healing and justice.

Collaboration:

NJCASA partners with organizations and communities who are also seeking to support survivors and create a world free from violence.





According to the CDC, over **2.7 million** survivors of sexual violence live in N.J., meaning approximately **1 in 3 New Jerseyans** have experienced contact sexual violence at some point in their lives.

Help is Available

Survivors of sexual violence and their loved ones can call NJ's **24-hour statewide hotline** at **800 - 601 - 7200** to be connected to support services closest to you.

Every county-based sexual violence program in NJ offers free services including:

Support Services:

Confidential sexual advocates (CSVAs) are available 24 hours a day to provide support during hospital exams, police interviews, court appearances, and more.

Community Education:

Education and ongoing community engagement efforts aim to increase awareness of sexual violence and the services available for survivors in their community.

Counseling:

Short-term individual or group counseling is available for survivors and their loved ones. Lengths of counseling services differ from center to center, but each one can provide a thoughtful referral to anyone looking for longer-term counseling and support.

Prevention Programming:

Primary prevention efforts address harmful norms and promote equity, respect, and consent.

In addition to our county-based programs, we also have a cohort of **culturally specific programs**. Culturally specific services are created by and for specific cultural communities and provide support with an emphasis on the experiences and needs of survivors in such communities and with recognition of the cultural complexities and layered identities of every individual.
